FEBRUARY DEMONSTRATION



lill Campbo



Jill has been exhibiting in the Hunter, Southern Highlands and Sydney for over 10 years but has been drawing and painting, she says, "forever". In her working life she taught at schools and university, including specializing in the visual arts.

She usually works in mixed media and likes to explore the huge variety of options that this offers. "There is always something new....."

Jill likes to have a "connection" with the environment she's painting and most of her work reflects this strong love of the landscape, especially the local area bushland and places she has visited. She works in collage and a range of media and textures in creating the layers evident in her work and she uses many layers over a period of time.

The mixed media technique she will be demonstrating lends itself to painting a variety of Australian native plants.

Australian Bush Gum Study in Mixed Media:

Materials:

Sketchbook

Half sheet of watercolour paper taped on board.

Small piece of candle wax (I break up a tealight to get "sharp' edges.)

Charcoal stick

A few sticks for ink drawing

Black and White acrylic inks

Coloured acrylic inks: Warm yellow, cool yellow,

warm red, Paynes grey -bring other colours that fit the gumleaves theme if you already have them. (Preferably Acrylic inks but you could use TRANSPARENT available resists.)

TRANSPARENT acrylic paints.)

Spray bottle

Cling wrap

Usual painting materials: brushes (including a rigger or needlepoint), paper towels, water container etc

Optional extras: silica packets containing "balls" of silica such as those you find in pill bottles, a container with separate compartments for ink colours - I use the ones small cakes or chocolates are packaged in. A small branch of gumleaves – I like to choose one with gumnuts bit seems to be the wrong season!




UPSCALING AN IMAGE VIA GRAPH


Do you have small image and finding it difficult to get the proportions right when trying to scale up to a large canvas? Using a proportion calculator, you can plan ahead and size your small image so that it can be enlarged with proportions maintained.

Proportion calculator

FIND A PROPORTION CALCULATOR ON THE INTERNET, OR TRY THIS LINK https://www.basic-mathematics.com/proportion-calculator.html



The calculator will tell you what size your drawing should be to easily scale it up to the canvas size



You can see here with these figures that it is not an exact, even increase in scale.

What you do now is a bit of maths.

Reset


50/20 = 2.5 -

Calculate


- $2. \quad 60/24 = 2.5$
- Your graph on drawing is eg, 2cm squares
- On the canvas multiply 2 x 2.5, = 5, so your graph lines on your canvas would be 5 cm apart.

Another example

An image 9cm x 18 to be enlarged to go onto a 50x 60 canvas.



Calculate for Width and Height for confidence in the process.



- 1. 50/9 = 5.5
- $2. \quad 60/10.8 = 5.5$
- 3. Multiply by the size of your original image graph squares (eg 1cm)
- 4. So your graph lines on the canvas would be 5.5 apart.
