Figurative drawing workshop.



Demonstration and definition of terms and processes that I use when life drawing and useful drawing techniques to apply to all genres ie learning to see. Our focus will be visual elements such as Composition, negative space, line, proportion and tone.

Using a professional draped model we will employ these techniques using traditional sequencing ie fast 10 sec drawings through to 20 min studies.

Requirements for the day

Melody will provide cartridge paper. Bring an easel if you have one. Bulldog clips, eraser, rag to rub out charcoal.

Willow charcoal. Bring either pastels, coloured pencils, oil pastels. Three of:- light medium dark of a colour. (whatever medium you like working in). Do not go out and buy especially for the workshop. 2b, 4b 6 b pencils. She just wants you to have fun and relax and enjoy the class.

FEBRUARY DEMONSTRATION RECAP

Another wonderful and informative demonstration from our guest, Jill Campbell.

To summarise some of her words of wisdom:

- Art Journaling is a great way to start a vision for a painting. When the ideas flow, creation starts and from there can be transferred to a canvas. Keep a working journal of notes, sketches, experiments
- This style of art work is layered, a collage of was, ink, various mediums everything and anything to get texture and interest in the work.
- Mix paints on baking paper, dry and keep in journal for reference.

Starting Paintings:

- Start with lots of drawings, observe and record detail
- Try repetitive drawing with different colours and thumbnail sketches.
- Use a viewfinder for outdoor sketching
- Three layers to start were used in these paintings wax, ink and charcoal.
- To create texture underneath use packets of silicate as found in many purched goods. Crystal type cat litter is also great as is cling wrap, placed and dried.
- A needle point brush is a great tool for detail
- A rigor brush is another essential tool.
