MARCH DEMONSTRATION



Since taking up painting in 2002, first in watercolour then other mediums, Hugh has built on a strong drawing background, attending many painting workshops with some of the best Australian artists. Working primarily in watercolours and pen & wash, he finds some subjects lend themselves to pastels, acrylics, charcoal or oils.



WORKSHOP - TRAVEL SKETCHING

In this workshop Hugh will share a variety of approaches to quick pen and wash

and watercolour paintings. He'll guide participants on how to use water-soluble inks to create rapid tonal works, as well as using waterproof pen and ink followed, or preceded, by watercolour. He will introduce some useful thinking tools for sketching, as well as identifying and practicing the key physical skills. More than other mediums, watercolour demands a convergence of physical skills and judgements in a short period of time that can be daunting, but which is the engine house of the delightful, almost magical outcomes that can be achieved. This workshop is suitable for all skill levels

Materials:

Brushes

- Medium sized squirrel hair (or good quality synthetic) round brush or 'mop' must come to a fine point when wet
- A smaller squirrel hair (or good quality synthetic) round brush
- Square synthetic brush for watercolour or acrylic, about 1 to 2.5cm wide (optional)
- A 'waterbrush' if you have one they hold water in the handle and are very handy for pen & wash **Watercolours**
- Artist quality watercolours a small travel kit with pans (or half pans) or you can bring tubes: a warm and cool of each of the three primaries e.g. lemon yellow, cadmium yellow, alizarin crimson, cadmium red or scarlet red, cobalt blue, ultramarine blue, plus yellow ochre or raw sienna, burnt sienna and white gouache.
- A white palette or plate to mix colours on and a water pot.

Paper

- A5 or A4 size (or similar) good quality watercolour paper, either 180 or 300gsm in thickness. Suitable brands include Arches, Baohong, Saunders, Eraldo, Canson, or generally any paper made from cotton.
- Cartridge paper can be in a sketchbook, or separate sheets, such as photocopy paper.

Pens and pencils

- Black waterproof pen, often marked 'waterproof', 'indelible', or 'water resistant'.
- A watersoluble pen such as an 'Artline Fineliner' pen. Test the pens and inks you have to see if they smudge with water.
- B or 2B pencil either a normal pencil or a mechanical pencil
